LITTLE ROCK, Ark. (July 5, 2023) — Goodwill Industries of Arkansas (GIA) is pleased to announce Darrick Williams as the organization’s new vice president of education and training. Williams will be responsible for overseeing the strategic and operational aspects of The Excel Center® and The Academy at Goodwill, both of which fall under the umbrella of Goodwill Training and Education Centers (GTEC) across the state. He will develop and implement recruitment and retention strategies that will have a significant positive impact on the communities served by GIA through education, training, and employment.

Darrick began his career as a classroom teacher in grades three through six in the Little Rock School District before becoming an elementary assistant principal then principal in the Pulaski County Special School District.

He received both his Bachelor of Science in Elementary Education and his Master of Education in Educational Administration from the University of Arkansas at Little Rock.
