**Goodwill Industries of Arkansas Partners in  
Tornado Relief Efforts  
Will Provide Vouchers to Help Individuals Replace Personal Needs**

**LITTLE ROCK, Ark. (April 3, 2023) -**

Many individuals and communities across Arkansas were impacted by tornadoes on March 31. We are committed to partnering in relief efforts to support those affected by the storms.

Goodwill Industries of Arkansas (GIA) is currently issuing vouchers to those who have lost personal belongings from the storms. Vouchers can be redeemed for goods at any Goodwill retail store in Arkansas and the gift vouchers do not expire. These vouchers can only be picked up through area partners that Goodwill is working alongside in these efforts. They are not available for pick up at the Goodwill retail stores.

"Most people who have been displaced by the tornadoes are in immediate need of food, water and shelter. It may be several days to weeks before they are in need of clothing and other household items. But when they are ready, these vouchers can be used anytime, at any location, for any item. We are here for them when they are ready," said GIA President and CEO, Brian Marsh.

In addition, GIA is partnering with the City of Little Rock to transport the items that have been donated to the relief effort, from donation centers to the public distribution centers. "We are in the business of receiving goods, sorting and transporting them. We are glad to be able to lend our expertise to assist with the relief efforts, and we are very happy to help our fellow Arkansans in every way we can," Marsh added. Currently, GIA is

sending their employees to volunteer at the City Center, Donation Stations and where they are needed most at this time.

During the month of April, all Goodwill stores in Arkansas will donate their "Round Up" program to provide the vouchers to those in need. When checking out, Goodwill customers will be asked if they'd like to "round up" their purchase to the nearest dollar to support the voucher program.
